1 SB205

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4 ENROLLED, An Act,

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To amend Section 41-4-412, Code of Alabama 1975,
relating to the terms of members of the Craft Training Board;
to allow members to be appointed for an additional term and to
provide for the staggering of the terms of the board.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

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Section 1. Section 41-4-412, Code of Alabama 1975,
is amended to read as follows:

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"§41-4-412.

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"(a) It is the intent of the Legislature to
establish and provide for a coordinated effort between the
construction industry and institutions of higher education and
other entities, including, but not limited to, union training
programs, to enhance the availability and quality of programs
which promote construction industry craft training and
education, and thereby enhance the availability and competence
of the work force for supporting the industry.

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"(b) In order to provide for efficient, competent,
and resourceful construction industry craft training programs
that will deliver the knowledge and skills necessary for
persons to learn and meet the skill requirements for a craft
and career in the construction industry trades and thereby

1 enhance the development of a quality labor pool to support the
2 construction industry of this state, there is established
3 within the Division of Construction Management of the
4 Department of Finance, a program to be known as the Alabama
5 Construction Industry Craft Training Program. The program
6 shall be managed and governed by the Craft Training Board
7 which shall consist of seven members selected as follows:

8 "(1) Two voting members appointed by the Governor
9 from a list of six members, or member representatives, of the
10 Associated Builders and Contractors of Alabama, Incorporated,
11 or its successor, submitted to the Governor by the Associated
12 Builders and Contractors of Alabama, Incorporated.

13 "(2) Two voting members appointed by the Governor
14 from a list of six members, or member representatives, of the
15 Associated General Contractors of America, Incorporated, or
16 its successor, submitted to the Governor by the Associated
17 General Contractors of America, Incorporated.

18 "(3) One voting member appointed by the Governor
19 from a list of three members, or member representatives, of
20 the Subcontractors Association of Alabama, or its successor,
21 submitted to the Governor by the Subcontractors Association of
22 Alabama.

23 "(4) One voting member appointed by the Governor
24 from a list of three members, or member representatives, of
25 the Birmingham Construction Industry Authority, or its

1 successor, submitted to the Governor by the Birmingham
2 Construction Industry Authority.

3 "(5) One voting member to be appointed by the
4 Governor from a list of three members, or member
5 representatives, of the Construction Users Roundtable, or its
6 successor, submitted to the Governor by the Construction Users
7 Roundtable.

8 "(c) When a craft training board member resigns or
9 otherwise relinquishes membership in the organization that
10 recommended his or her appointment by the Governor, the
11 resignation or relinquishment shall automatically result in
12 forfeiture of membership on the board. Any vacancy on the
13 board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor upon the
14 recommendation of the relevant organization for the remainder
15 of the unexpired term.

16 "(d) ~~Appointments to the craft training board shall~~
17 ~~be made by October 15, 2016.~~ Each board member of the Craft
18 Training Board shall serve for a ~~three-year~~ term and of three
19 years or until a successor is appointed, qualified, and
20 assumes office. The terms of all board members serving on the
21 effective date of the act adding this language shall expire
22 October 15, 2018. Board members shall be ~~ineligible for~~
23 reappointment eligible for reappointment, but shall not serve
24 more than two consecutive terms. All board members appointed
25 to fill terms beginning October 16, 2018, shall serve

1 staggered terms as follows: Two board members shall be
2 appointed to serve a term of one year expiring October 15,
3 2019; two board members shall be appointed to serve a term of
4 two years expiring October 15, 2020; and three board members
5 shall be appointed to serve a term of three years expiring
6 October 15, 2021. All board members appointed to the board
7 thereafter shall be appointed for a term of three years. The
8 ~~organizational meeting of the board shall be held during the~~
9 ~~last 10 days of October 2016 at the time and place determined~~
10 ~~by the board members representing the Alabama Associated~~
11 ~~General Contractors of America, Incorporated.~~ At the first
12 meeting, the ~~craft training~~ board shall elect its chair and
13 officers. Thereafter, the board shall determine its meeting
14 schedule. The board shall meet at least quarterly. No member
15 shall draw any salary for any service he or she may render or
16 for any duty he or she may perform in connection with the
17 board, but shall be entitled to reimbursement of reasonable
18 expenses incurred that are directly related to the duties in
19 serving as a member of the board. The membership of the board
20 shall be inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic,
21 urban/rural and economic diversity of the state. The board may
22 also appoint geographically oriented advisory committees and
23 invite local employers and employees in the construction
24 industry to relate specific labor force problems that may be
25 solved by the craft training program. The advisory committees

1 may be composed of individuals who are not craft training
2 board members.

3 "(e) In addition to any other power established
4 pursuant to this part, the craft training board shall have the
5 following powers to be exercised in its discretion:

6 "(1) To develop curricula for use in craft training
7 programs.

8 "(2) To establish forms, criteria, guidelines, and
9 procedures regarding construction industry craft training
10 programs and procedures to be used in requesting
11 appropriations of funds from the Craft Training Fund.

12 "(3) To solicit and receive from institutions of
13 higher education and other entities, including, but not
14 limited to, union training programs, applications for use of
15 monies in the Craft Training Fund, to be used in the
16 implementation of craft training programs and in accordance
17 with this part.

18 "(4) To disburse funds from the Craft Training Fund
19 consistent with this section and which the Craft Training
20 Board deems appropriate and under such conditions and terms as
21 the Craft Training Board deems appropriate.

22 "(5) To provide grants to educational, governmental,
23 nonprofit, community-based, workforce development, economic
24 development, and other organizations and associations engaged
25 in the education, training, and professional development of

1 persons engaged in activities leading to the furtherance of
2 careers in nonresidential construction in accordance with the
3 purposes of this part and which the Craft Training Board deems
4 appropriate, and under such conditions and terms as the Craft
5 Training Board deems appropriate.

6 "(f) The Craft Training Board shall have exclusive
7 control over the expenditure of all funds in the Craft
8 Training Fund, as well as the exclusive authority to exercise
9 the powers specifically listed in subsection (e). A majority
10 of the members of the Craft Training Board shall constitute a
11 quorum for the transaction of any and all business of the
12 Craft Training Board. The director, technical staff, and
13 support personnel of the Division of Construction Management
14 of the Department of Finance shall implement the resolutions
15 and decisions of the Craft Training Board. The Craft Training
16 Board shall be responsible for reimbursing the Division of
17 Construction Management of the Department of Finance, from the
18 Craft Training Fund the costs it incurs in order to administer
19 the program."

20 Section 2. This act shall become effective
21 immediately following its passage and approval by the
22 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
