- Delivering a technically-sound design solution on time and on budget

This selection will retain the **Project Team** to provide Basic Services B-E and appropriate Additional Services to design the Village Residence Halls- Interior Refurbishments. This selection is based upon the following parameters:

- This project will renovate all 8 buildings of the Village Residence Hall Community, includes suite style rooms, a total of 484 suites (3-4 bedrooms each).
- The halls were built in 2009, no upgrades have been applied to the buildings until now.
- The proposed project is anticipated to be completed in 3 phases, beginning summer 2022 through summer 2025 (phase I-- 12 month, phase II- 12 month, phase III 14 month)
- The successful firm will be selected based upon documented qualifications of the Project Team and demonstrated ability support AU, as determined during the interview.
