ADVERTISEMENT FOR
REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ)**

Pursuant to §41-4-133 of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended, the International Motorsports Hall of Fame (IMHOF), requests qualifications from qualified design professionals to provide architectural/engineering services under an Open-Ended Agreement, on an as needed basis, for various projects located at its Talladega, Alabama facility.

Proposed Scope of Work: The scope of work for professional design services shall include but not be limited to full architectural and or engineering services for HVAC improvements and modernization to three main museum facilities, parking lot improvements, weatherization improvements and reroofing projects.

The estimated construction budget for this open-end agreement is \$2,000,000.00. The type of funding is local funding through various grants.

The term of the agreement will be two (2) years, with an option to renew for two (2) additional years. The design services will be contracted under both fees and hourly rates in accordance with the Manual of Procedures of the State of Alabama Department of Finance, Real Property Management, Division of Construction Management (DCM).

Qualifications: The Applicants shall demonstrate experience with similar projects and demonstrate familiarity with DCM's procedures and forms for design and construction as it relates to similar state of Alabama fully locally funded projects. The Applicants and any consultants shall hold current professional licenses and be registered in the State of Alabama. Recognizing the composition of Alabama's citizenship, IMHOF encourages submittals from design professionals that represent Alabama firms with diversity in their staffing, proposed project team, and associated design professionals and consultants.

Minimum Code of Alabama Requirements (current Code of Alabama available at <https://alison.legislature.state.al.us/code-of-alabama>):

§41-16-82 of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended requires a disclosure statement to be completed and filed with all qualifications, proposals, bids, contracts, or grant proposals submitted to the State of Alabama in excess of \$5,000.00.

§31-13-1, et seq. of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended (Alabama Immigration Law) imposes conditions on the award of state contracts. Firms must agree to fully comply with the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended by the Immigration Act of 1990, and the Beason-Hammon Alabama Taxpayer and Citizen

Protection Act. Architects and engineers should review and adhere to these guidelines as appropriate to their project type.

§41-16-5 of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended, imposes conditions on the award of state contracts. The firm must certify that it is not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, the boycott of a person or an entity based in or doing business with a jurisdiction with which this state can enjoy open trade.

§41-16-163 of the Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended requires the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they are not currently engaged in, and will not engage in, economic boycotts.

Response: Interested professionals shall submit:

1. A letter of interest.
2. A statement of qualification utilizing GSA Standard Form 330 for the primary firm and all proposed consultants, information for similar relevant projects including the project description, project budget, scope of work, photographs (before and after), Owner's name and contact information, plus any other relevant information. Form 330 is available at <https://www.gsa.gov/forms>. List any specialized consultants related to this project type in the Proposed Team Part I.C.
3. A completed Alabama Vendor Disclosure Statement. The form is available at <https://www.alabamaag.gov/forms-and-links/>.

Qualifications Submittal Evaluation Criteria: Selection by IMHOF shall be based on factors which may include, among others, the following:

- a. Experience and competence of the firm and its principals with design professionals licensed and currently registered to practice in the State of Alabama.
- b. Previous experience working on State of Alabama Projects and familiarity with the Division of Construction Management's procedures.
- c. Team must show experience and extensive prior knowledge of HVAC replacements, and the other disciplines listed in the scope of work, with projects of equal or greater size and complexity in the last 5 years.
- d. Specialized expertise, capabilities, and technical competence including familiarity with conditions, codes, and other ordinances where such knowledge is essential to the proper performance of the contract.
- e. Record of past performance, quality of work, ability to meet schedules, cost control, and contract administration.
- f. Proposed project management techniques.
- g. The team's location and ability to visit and monitor the sites for the duration of the project.

Qualifications must be received no later than 4:00 PM (Central Standard Time) on Tuesday August 18, 2026.
